The Impact of Social Policies on Health: Reflections on the State of the Evidence

As population health research has evolved, there has been increased recognition of the effects of social policies on health. In particular, the structure of social assistance programs, which has recently been the topic of great debate, is hypothesized to be a factor in determining the health of society's most income insecure. This lecture will examine the findings of a recent study, in which we empirically assessed the health effects of social assistance programs in Canada, the United Kingdom, and the United States. It will also examine the broader environment of policy formation that helps to contextualize the findings.
